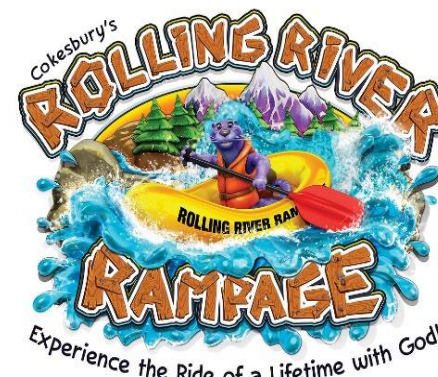

Upon the death of Debbie Evans in June, 2016, the ministry changed it’s name to the **Debbie Evans Prayer Shawl Ministry.**
